What's your vision for Lake Sambell in the future?

The Lake Sambell Management Committee and Indigo Shire are inviting interested residents to discuss their vision for Lake Sambell, and come down and celebrate the 21st birthday of the Lake Sambell Committee of Management at Sandy Beach from 5-7pm on Saturday 19 November.

The event will celebrate the opening of the boat ramp, canoe launch and amenities block, with a children's jumping castle and an address from the Lake Sambell Management Committee about ongoing projects including revegetating the lake's foreshore.

"A map of Lake Sambell and butcher's paper will be distributed so residents can jot down their thoughts on how they want to see the lake's facilities develop in the future," said Indigo's Mayor Ali Pockley.

The canoe launch and boat ramp were installed by Indigo Shire's contractors in January 2011 and funded by the State Government's Department of Transport, providing \$38,438. The amenities block was finished in March 2011, funded by Regional Development Victoria, Indigo Shire and the Beechworth community.

"We've certainly achieved a lot over the last few years at Lake Sambell, and this is an opportunity for interested residents to build a vision and get involved in the future of this beautiful place," said Iris Mannik, Secretary of the Lake Sambell Management Committee.
